PELICANS ON THE AIR

The New Orleans Pelicans and Gulf Coast Sports & Entertainment Network will begin their second year of bringing a variety of both home and road games into the homes of the Greater New Orleans area and Gulf South region. Gulf Coast Sports & Entertainment Network is scheduled to broadcast 80 regular season games, including 12 simultaneous broadcasts on WVUE - FOX 8. **Joel Meyers** (Play-by-Play), **Antonio Daniels** (Color Analyst) and **Andrew Lopez** (Sideline Reporter) return to the broadcast team. The broadcast team provides viewers with an engaging viewership experience through their dynamic commentary, seamlessly blending insightful analysis with passionate enthusiasm. Included will be a live 30-minute pre and post-game show, as well as additional programming.



The Gulf Coast Sports & Entertainment Network is now available in 14 markets throughout the Gulf South region – joining the previously announced markets in Louisiana (Alexandria, Baton Rouge, Lafayette, Lake Charles, Monroe, New Orleans, and Shreveport); Mississippi (Biloxi, Hattiesburg, Jackson, and Meridian); and Alabama (Mobile). The distribution agreement with Gray Media now makes Pelicans games available to nearly 10.4 million viewers throughout the Gulf South. Games will be accessible via an over-the-air antenna or a local cable or satellite provider that carries the Gulf Coast Sports & Entertainment Network. WVUE-TV and Gray Media announced this year that DIRECTV will now offer the Gulf Coast Sports & Entertainment Network (GCSN), bringing New Orleans Pelicans games to DIRECTV subscribers within the 14 television markets where the GCSN is available.

All 82 regular season games, the entire preseason and the Pelicans' playoff contests will be heard on the team's flagship station WWL, 870 AM, as the Pelicans enter their second of a multi-season agreement with Audacy. **Todd Graffagnini** is in his seventh season as the radio voice of the Pelicans. Additionally, **Gus Kattengell** enters his second full-time season as the Pelicans Producer/Radio Host. For a complete list of radio affiliates, visit Pelicans.com.

KEY STATS:

- In the first half, the Spurs converted 11-of-19 (.579) from three-point range, while the Pelicans only shot 4-of-17 (.235) from behind the arc. Additionally, San Antonio shot 12-of-14 (.857) from the free throw line in the first half, while New Orleans only had four free throw attempts finishing 3-of-4 (.750) from the stripe.
- In the third quarter, the Pelicans outscored the Spurs 45-23, shooting 16-of-21 (.762) from the floor and a perfect 12-of-12 from the free throw line, while San Antonio only converted 11-of-25 (.440) from the field and 1-of-2 (.500) from the free throw stripe.
- The Pelicans outscored the Spurs 84-62 in points in the paint.
- The Spurs converted 17-of-36 (.472) from three-point distance, while New Orleans only shot 7-of-26 (.269) from behind the arc.
- The Pelicans scored 45 points in the third quarter which is the most points scored in any quarter this season.
- Derik Queen posted his first career triple-double, scoring 33 points, hauling in 10 rebounds and tossing out 10 assists. Queen becomes the third rookie in franchise history to notch a triple-double, along with Chris Paul (twice) and Darren Collison. Additionally, Queen becomes the ninth NBA player this season to notch a 30-point triple-double. Queen becomes the first rookie center in NBA history to post a 30-point triple-double. In the third quarter, Derik Queen posted 21 points on a perfect 6-of-6 from the floor and a perfect 9-of-9 from the free throw line. Queen's 21 points is the most points scored in any quarter in the NBA this season without missing a field goal. Additionally, Queen's 21 points in the third frame is the second-most points scored by a rookie in any quarter in franchise history. Lastly, Queen becomes the third player since the play-by-play era (1996-97) to post 21-plus points, four or more rebounds and five-plus assists in a quarter, along with Bradley Beal and Luka Dončić.
- Herb Jones returned to the starting lineup after missing eight games due to a calf strain. Jones finished with 17 points, six rebounds, four assists, one block and a season-high four steals while shooting 6-of-10 (.600) from the floor and a perfect 5-of-5 from the free throw line. This marks the 27th time in Jones' career of posting four or more steals in a game.
- Trey Murphy III posted 32 points on 13-of-21 (.619) from the floor, 2-of-6 (.333) from behind the arc and 4-of-5 (.800) from the free throw stripe. Murphy added three boards, four dimes, two steals and a block in 38 minutes of action. This marks the fourth time this season he has scored 30 points or more.

- On 12/8/25 vs. San Antonio, Pelicans rookie Derik Queen posted his first career triple-double, scoring 33 points, hauling in 10 rebounds, tossing out 10 assists and swatting three blocks in 33 minutes of play.
 - Franchise History:**
 - Queen is the **only rookie in franchise history** to post a 30-point triple-double.
 - Queen becomes the **third rookie in franchise history** to notch a triple-double, along with Chris Paul (twice) and Darren Collison.
 - League Wide:**
 - Queen is the **only player** this season to post a 30-point triple-double and notch three blocks.
 - Queen is the **fifth player** this season to post a 33-point triple-double.
 - Queen became the **ninth NBA player** this season to notch a 30-point triple-double.
 - All-Time NBA History:**
 - Queen is the 5th player in NBA history to post a 30-point triple-double, shooting 70.0% or better from the floor and notch three blocks, along with Nikola Jokić (3/6/22), Giannis Antetokounmpo (12/29/18), Charles Barkley (11/4/86) and Magic Johnson (4/8/83).
 - All-Time Rookie Achievements:**
 - Queen is the **first rookie center in NBA history** to post a 30-point triple-double in a regular season game.
 - Note: Kareem Abdul-Jabbar went 38-23-11 in the 1970 East Division Finals.
 - Queen is the **first rookie** to have 30-10-10 and three blocks since at least 1973-74 (when blocks were officially tracked).
 - Queen is the **first rookie in NBA history** to have a 30-point triple-double while attempting 15 or fewer shots.
 - Queen is the **11th rookie in NBA history** to score 33 or more points and notch a triple-double. The last time this happened was on 1/27/19, when Luka Dončić posted 35 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists against Toronto.
 - Third Quarter:**
 - In the third quarter, Derik Queen posted 21 points on a perfect 6-of-6 from the floor and a perfect 9-of-9 from the free throw line.
 - Queen's 21 points is the **most points scored in any quarter in the NBA** this season without missing a field goal.
 - Additionally, Queen's 21 points in the third frame is the **second-most points scored by a rookie in any quarter in franchise history**.
 - Lastly, Queen is the **third player since the play-by-play era** (1996-97) to post 21-plus points, four or more rebounds and five-plus assists in a quarter, along with Bradley Beal and Luka Dončić.

- Over the Pelicans' last 8 games (11/24 vs. CHI – 12/8 vs. SAS), New Orleans has been stepping it up on the offensive end. Below is a look at where the Pelicans rank among NBA teams since 11/24:

- Second year center Yves Missi has been crashing the offensive glass this season averaging 3.2 offensive rebounds per game.
 - Missi is **ranked 4th among NBA players in offensive rebounds** for all players who average 20 minutes or less per game.

Poole Party:

- Pelicans guard Jordan Poole scored 30 points off the bench against the Clippers on October 31, 2025. Poole converted 9-of-15 (.600) from the floor, including 7-of-13 (.538) from three-point distance.
 - Poole's 30-point performance off the bench is tied for the third-most points scored by any NBA player off the bench this season.

- On 11/21/25 at Dallas, Pelicans rookie Derik Queen was dropping dimes in the first quarter, tossing out seven assists.

- Queen's seven assists in the first quarter are the **most assists by a rookie in any quarter this season**, surpassing VJ Edgecombe (10/27/25 – Q4) and Derik Queen (11/8/25 – Q4) with six each.
 - Additionally, Queen is also tied for the **fifth-most assists in a quarter by a rookie in franchise history**.

 - Additionally, Queen becomes the **only rookie in Pelicans franchise history** to post 30 points, nine rebounds and two blocks.

Trail Blazing:

- On 11/12 vs. POR, Pelicans rookie Derik Queen came off the bench and posted 26 points on 12-of-18 (.667) from the floor and 2-of-3 (.667) from the free throw line. Queen added seven boards and four dimes in 38 minutes of action.
- Queen becomes the eighth rookie to come off the bench in NBA history and post 26 points, seven rebounds, four assists and shoot 65.0% or better from the field.

Joe Dumars ▪ Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations

- On April 16, 2025 Dumars was named the New Orleans Pelicans' Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations.
- Dumars joins the Pelicans after most recently serving as Executive Vice President, Head of Basketball Operations for the National Basketball Association, overseeing all Basketball Operations matters, including the enforcement of playing rules and interpretations, conduct and discipline, and policies and procedures relating to the operation of games.
- Prior to joining the league office in May 2022, Dumars worked three seasons with the Sacramento Kings, the last two as Chief Strategy Officer. In this role, he helped drive strategy across the organization's entire portfolio of activities, including business, basketball, new ventures, entertainment and real estate.
- Dumars previously served 15 seasons as a basketball executive with the Detroit Pistons (1999-2014), including the final 14 as President of Basketball Operations. With Dumars overseeing player personnel decisions, the Pistons won an NBA championship in 2004, made six consecutive appearances in the Eastern Conference Finals and recorded at least 50 victories in seven straight seasons. He was named NBA Basketball Executive of the Year for the

2002-03 season.

- Dumars joined the Pistons' front office after a decorated 14-year playing career in the NBA, all with Detroit, which selected him in the first round of the 1985 NBA Draft. A six-time NBA All-Star selection, three-time All-NBA Team honoree and five-time NBA All-Defensive Team member, Dumars helped the Pistons win back-to-back championships in 1989 and 1990 and was named MVP of the 1989 Finals. In international competition, Dumars won a gold medal with USA Basketball at the 1994 FIBA Basketball World Cup. He was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2006.
- In addition to his success as an NBA player and executive, Dumars served as President of the Basketball Division for Independent Sports & Entertainment, an integrated sports, media, entertainment and management company, from 2017-19. He also founded the automotive supply company Detroit Technologies Inc. and Joe Dumars Fieldhouse, an indoor sports and entertainment complex with two locations in the Detroit area.
- A native of Natchitoches, Louisiana, Dumars holds a bachelor's degree in business management from McNeese State University, where he was a four-time selection to the All-Southland Conference First Team. Dumars is a member of the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame.

Coaching Notes

- James Borrego was named Interim Head Coach of the New Orleans Pelicans on November 15, 2025, after serving as the franchise's Associate Head Coach since the start of the 2023-24 campaign.

- Prior to joining the Pelicans, Borrego served as the Head Coach of the Charlotte Hornets from 2018-2022, accruing a 136-163 record over four seasons that included two Play-In Tournament berths. In his final season with Charlotte in 2021-22, Borrego led the team to 43 wins, marking the franchise's second-highest win total since 2009-10. Borrego picked up the 100th win of his career as a head coach with a victory on April 18, 2021 vs. Portland.

- The Albuquerque, New Mexico native began his NBA career as an Assistant Video Coordinator with San Antonio prior to the 2003-04 season, spending seven seasons with the Spurs under Head Coach Gregg Popovich and ascending to the role of Assistant Coach prior to his departure. No stranger to the Crescent City, he served two seasons as an Assistant Coach with New Orleans from 2010-2012 under Monty Williams. Borrego joined Jacque Vaughn's staff with the Orlando Magic and served three seasons under Vaughn from 2013-2015. Borrego gained his initial head coaching experience in the NBA serving the final 30 games of the 2014-15 season as the Interim Head Coach after Vaughn's dismissal. After returning to San Antonio for a second stint as an Assistant Coach for three seasons (2015-18), Borrego was hired as Charlotte's Head Coach.

- In his 20 seasons in the NBA, Borrego has been a part of staffs in San Antonio and New Orleans that have led teams to the playoffs 12 different times. Borrego has been a part of two NBA championship teams and been to four Conference Finals total.

- Prior to the NBA, Borrego served two seasons (2001-03) as an Assistant Coach at University of San Diego, his alma mater. Additionally, Borrego played four seasons collegiately for the Toreros from 1998-2001.

- Borrego has dedicated much of his time in the offseason to expanding the game of basketball's international influence. He participated in the NBA's Basketball Without Borders Asia in 2012, Basketball Without Borders Argentina in 2013, NBA Camp Cuba in 2015 as well as Basketball Without Borders Americas in 2017.

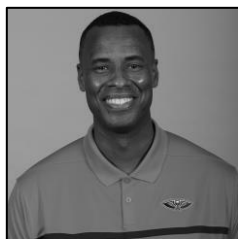
